Choose one of the following projects. Be sure to include specific details from your book, and be creative and neat!

1. Character Collage

Create a **digital or paper-based** collage of photos that relate to your character's experiences, conflict, and personality. If you choose digital, use the site(s): www.befunky.com or www.canva.com

Include:

- ✓ Title and author of book
- ✓ At least 8 pictures, images, drawings, and/or objects and at least 2 quotes from the story.
- ✓ Minimum of 6-8 sentence description of the meaning of the collage in connection to story on a separate sheet of paper.

2. Character Symbol

Create a **3D, non-paper hand-made object or baked good** that has symbolic meaning in the story.

Include:

- ✓ Title and author of book
- ✓ Creative materials OTHER than paper
- ✓ Minimum of a 6-8 sentence description of the meaning of symbol in relationship to the story (Can be done on paper)

3. Character Poem

Purposefully circle words on a piece of typed text (your teacher will have text pages available if needed) to form a "poem" about your main character. Then, draw a meaningful image to 'blackout' the most or all of the remaining text so that your poem stands out.

Include:

- ✓ Title and author of book
- ✓ At least 10 words in your poem
- ✓ Minimum of a 6-8 sentence description of the meaning of the poem and image on a separate sheet of paper
